

## 2021 CALS Global Opportunity Initiative

CALS Global and the Virginia-Maryland College of Veterinary Medicine are pleased to offer the third Global Opportunity Initiative. Applications are invited from eligible faculty who wish to strengthen skills for global engagement and...

- Simplify complex research challenges
- Refine your research pitch
- Build your collaboration and networking skills
- Add systems thinking to your skills toolbox
- Work with like-minded faculty with a focus on global engagement
- Network with organizations active in global engagement
- Partner with colleagues globally to develop project ideas and fundable proposals

The theme for the 2021 virtual Global Opportunity Initiative is **strengthening food systems for food security, health, and community vitality.** If you have interest/expertise in any of these three areas—food security, health (human, animal, plant), or community vitality—please apply! We will build a transdisciplinary cohort, with faculty from any CALS or VM department eligible to apply.

The 2021 GOI Fellows will participate in up to 24 hours of synchronous and asynchronous <u>virtual capacity-building workshops</u> with Kenyan and Tanzanian faculty colleagues during March through May 2021. Using the knowledge gained, this international team will help lead <u>virtual collaboration events</u> for additional faculty across these institutions during June 2021. Engagement with partners in East Africa will continue well past the formal sessions. GOI Fellows who wish to subsequently travel to East Africa for in-person collaboration with colleagues will be prioritized for CALS Global Partnership Initiative funding when travel becomes advisable.

## For 2021, we will select up to eight GOI Fellows. The following criteria will determine eligibility:

- Tenured and tenure-track CALS and VM Assistant, Associate, and full Professors are eligible. Collegiate and other faculty in longer-term positions with responsibilities for resource generation are also eligible.
- Applications will be evaluated on 1) disciplinary fit with the objectives for the cohort, 2) career stage (priority to early-career faculty) and 3) candidate statement and likelihood of continued global engagement.

## Expectations for GOI Fellows are as follows:

- Attend and participate fully in all synchronous and asynchronous virtual capacitybuilding workshops during March - May 2021
- Attend and participate fully in all synchronous and asynchronous virtual collaboration events during June 2021
- Participate in proposal and program development with partners and colleagues seeking competitive funding (pending appropriate opportunities)
- Help promote the program within CALS and VM
